BACKGROUND:

The portfolio of the City has a total cost value of R9, 263 billion and it comprised of 28 193 properties for the period ending 30 June 2022. The table below illustrates a high-level summary, which outlines the number of properties and values per region.

The properties of the City include Agricultural, Commercial Offices, Commercial Retail Industrial, Informal Markets, Infrastructure (Power, Transport, Water, and Public Service etc.), Residential Housing, Social (Churches, Crèches, City Parks, Community Development, Education, Health, Housing, Sports & Recreation, housing, etc.), Vacant Land, etc.

SCOPE:

The properties that are not required for municipal services are sometimes leased to external parties. JPC currently has around 14 000 leases in their accounting system, which need to be verified and audited to supporting documentation. The appointed service provider will need to physically verify that the property is indeed owned by the City by checking the deeds office and Asset register among other procedures.

The scope of the projects includes the following

- The objective of this review is to provide reasonable assurance on the accuracy, completeness, and validity of the JPC Portfolio lease register and its lease contracts.
- Review the lease register and confirm the validity, completeness and accuracy of information recorded from the lease contracts into the Nicor Propsys system, including but not limited to:
 - o Lessee details
 - Erf and site descriptions
 - Terms of the lease contract
- Ensuring that the CoJ Asset Register is compliant with all applicable legislation and GRAP Standards
- Liaison with Deeds office to ensure completeness of properties owned by the City
- Be a lead auditor for asset verification of the City, working with other firms.
- Prepare and update the system description for the asset register
- Assess the correctness of the accounting policy for leases, including developmental leases, etc.





- Prepare and update the system description for the leases, including the recommendation of controls to improve the control environment.
- Remove possible duplication on the 14 000 lease transaction
- Separate the list between active and expired leases
- Confirm the status of the expired leases, property vacant, if not who is occupying the property, and monthly rental.
- All leases to be agreed to take on forms and lease agreement.
- Review controls around the timely renewal of leases so that revenue generation can be enhanced
- Where possible, identify risks related to the JPC Portfolio leasing and recommend mitigating actions and solutions
- The scope of physical verification includes the following;
 - Perform physical verification and confirm that the property is being used for its stated purpose to determine the current accounting classification.
 - Conduct site inspection of the properties.
 - Perform an Asset Audit using the Site Inspection Form by completing the form and engaging the occupants of the properties (where required). Site Inspection Form will be issued to the appointed service provider.
 - Give assets the condition grading which will be used for impairment assessment and useful lives assessment as required by GRAP 16, 17 and 21.
 - Perform a visual assessment of the condition of the property and flag the properties that require a detailed condition assessment.
 - Scan the completed Site Inspection Forms and save them using their respective asset numbers.
 - Take visual photos of the properties (at least ten photos inside and outside if improved property) and save them using their respective asset numbers.
 - Take a video of the property to provide a virtual tour of the property and save them using their respective asset numbers.
 - Flag all properties that are potentially illegally occupied based on your site audit finding.
 - Hyperlink the photos to the Audited Asset Register (Annexure B) for each asset that has been verified.
 - Scan the completed Site Inspection Forms (Annexure A) and save them using their respective asset numbers.
 - Assets verification will be for all leased properties, Region A, Region C and Outside COJ.
 - The service provider will be expected to appoint interns from the Regions where assets verification occurs.

- 2. Section 4(1)(b)(iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).²

CONSENT AND ACKNOWLEDGMENTS IN TERMS OF THE PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION ACT 2013 (POPI)

1. What is personal information?

3. How will JPC process personal information?

JPC will only collect personal information for the purpose as stated above. Information will be collected in the following manner:

- directly from the individual
- through the documents submitted with the tender/quotation;
- from service providers who provided services or goods to JPC;
- from JPC's own records relating to previous supply of services or goods; and/or
- from a relevant public or equivalent entity.

4. To whom will personal information be disclosed?
