Proof must be provided that forward Exchange Rate cover has been taken out within 14 days after an order has been placed. 

CONSENT AND ACKNOWLEDGMENTS IN TERMS OF THE PROTECTION OF PERSONAL INFORMATION ACT 2013 (POPI)
